Introducing a new Winter Sprint Triathlon: The Balaclava Blitz! It will take place Sunday, February 18, 2018, 9:00 AM at Bayside Park. Racers must be 16 years of age or older. Divisions include Individual Men (Ages 16 - 29); Individual Women (Ages 16 - 29); Individual Men (Ages 30+); Individual Women (Ages 30+). Proposed Formation of a Regional Dispatch: Chittenden County Public Safety Authority, a Union Municipal District

At their December 12 meeting the Selectboard approved and adopted the Resolution for Formation of a Union Municipal District to be placed before voters on the March 6, 2018 ballot. The proposed new organization would deliver regional public safety dispatch service in Chittenden County.

A regional dispatch center combined with a 911 call center can reduce the response time for many emergency calls by about 70 seconds per call! When every second can make a difference in emergency outcome, this is a significant improvement.

Nineteen public safety officials representing eight communities in Chittenden County support the formation of a Regional Dispatch Center. Voter approval will authorize formation of the Chittenden County Public Safety Authority (PSA) but will not obligate municipalities to pay for or receive services. On the Financial Front: FY 18 Budget Update

Five months through the fiscal year, revenues are higher than expenses by \$704,160. This is a net positive of 6%.





- Expenditures are 3% under budget primarily due to the Public Works-Highway, Planning & Zoning, and Police departments, as well as the Manager's office.
- Revenues are 3% over budget. Primary contributors include property taxes and state, rescue, and police revenues.
- Expenditures may trend closer to budget in the coming months due to increased seasonal staffing (winter and spring/summer) and some supply items that have been ordered but not yet received and paid for.

Local Option Tax Fund: As of November 30, the balance of the Local Option Tax Fund (restricted to voter approved capital projects) is \$1,005,937. In FY 18, we have received \$457,980 in revenue and made \$548,266 in payments for such projects.

- To run for any of the offices mentioned above you need to submit a petition stating the office for which you wish to run, the length of the term, and collect the signatures of 30 registered voters. We cannot accept petitions that do not state the term of office. If you have questions or would like a blank petition please contact us. The deadline to submit a petition is 5 pm on Monday, January 30, 2018.
- There will be a proposed charter change amendment on the ballot: to change the elected clerk and treasurer to an appointed position. I support the proposal and will go into more detail with the reasons in my report next month.
