After initial observation it was decided to close the Causeway for safety. The Town is still in the process of fully assessing the damage, securing repair estimates, and timelines for reopening. Spring is finally here and the Library is hopping! Did you know 265 people filed their taxes at the library, thanks to the help of AARP's Tax Aide Service volunteers? We've also added 74 titles to our Green Mountain Library Consortium Overdrive catalog, which expands our collection of downloadable audio and e-books, available via our webpage under Digital Services. 

- Construction Update on Routes 7/2, 2A & 127 Intersections Improvement Project: Work to resume mid-May: VTRANS will resume work on the Routes 7/2, 2A & 127 Intersections in mid-May and finish by the end of August.

VTRANS will delay work that requires lane closures until 8:30am to allow work and school traffic to proceed as normally as possible. Afternoon commuters should plan for delays. Afternoon construction cannot be restricted if the project is to be completed by the end of August. Construction will shut down for Memorial Day weekend, July 3 & 4, and in late July for the Colchester Triathlon.
