
Green Up Day Results: Green Up Day took place



on May 1 and had a strong rebound after the 2020 event was cancelled due to the pandemic. All 18 CSWD member communities participated and Chittenden County recorded a total of 41.4 tons of trash and 2,631 tires collected. CSWD hadn't seen over 30 tons collected since 2015.

Colchester collected a total of 4.23 tons of trash and 2.59 tons of tires, or about 241 total tires.

Thank you to CSWD for waiving fees on the trash and tires collected, to Meyers for donating and hauling the roll-off, to the Conservation Commission for organizing this year's Green Up Day, to the Public Works Department for cleaning up all the bags and items left on the side of the road, and to all the individuals and community groups who participated.

#### **Vermont Forward Update**

As of Monday, June 14, more than 80% of eligible Vermonters have received at least one dose of a COVID-19 vaccine. Governor Phil Scott has authorized the move to Step 4 of the Vermont Forward Plan. Gathering, and travel-related restrictions are fully lifted.

### **Economic Recovery Bridge Program**

The Agency of Commerce and Community Development (ACCD) has opened the Economy Recovery Bridge Program and has started accepting rolling applications. \$30 million of funds from the American Rescue Act are available to eligible businesses who have not received prior State or Federal financial assistance. Those businesses will receive priority for the first 30-day grant window, and then other businesses who have suffered a tax loss even after receiving aid will be invited to apply for remaining funds. ### **COVID-19 Modeling**


According to the latest modeling by the Department of Financial Regulation, Vermont COVID-19 cases are down 91% since their last peak in April. The state is seeing some of the lowest rates of infection since the end of last summer. Vermont is also scoring first in the country in doses administered, % received at least one dose (eligible and full population), % fully vaccinated, and doses administered 65+ per 100K. In addition, the northeast region has seen a 33.8% decrease in new cases, with new cases down 91% in the last 9 weeks.


# **Regional Cases**

A big thank you also goes out to volunteers, Mike Lapan and Selectboard Chair Pam Loranger, Colchester Technical Rescue and the Parks & Recreation staff who helped to make this event
