# Town Manager's Message

The Colchester Reef Lighthouse helped Lake Champlain's mariners navigate nearby treacherous shoals for over sixty years. During its service from December 1871 to August 1933, eleven keepers resided there. Once decommissioned, the lighthouse was abandoned for almost 20 years until auctioned to Shelburne Museum's founder, Electra Webb. The relocation and restoration of the two-story residence began in 1952, and it wasn't until 2006 when the Colchester Reef Lighthouse shined its light once again, except this time it was powered by the sun!

In December 2020, the Raub family delivered a second model of the Colchester Reef Lighthouse to Town Hall in honor of Bill Raub. Thomas C. Raub donated his first model of the lighthouse to the Town in 2013, displayed outside the Historical Society. After enduring six seasons of Vermont's winter, the first model needed many repairs, and Thomas C. undertook the construction of a second model, which is now on display at Town Hall.
