Free At-Home COVID-19 Tests: The Clerk's Office has received and will be distributing 928 At-Home COVID-19 test kits from the State of Vermont. These kits are free of charge, as the State has discontinued inperson testing sites, and up to 4 kits (8 tests) per person are available upon request.
