#### Renewable Energy Update:

The Planning Commission in their role as the Energy Committee as defined in this <u>Selectboard Policy</u> has been updated on completed or ongoing energy projects. Implementation of energy efforts has been assigned to the Town Manager's office. In addition to having access to the entire Town staff to assist in these goals, both Town Manager and Deputy Town Manager have a prior history with and enjoy working on energy projects. Annual reports to the Planning Commission have been given in advance of the Annual Town Reports, and have included an energy section in: <u>2021</u>, <u>2020</u>, and <u>2019</u>. Annual reports to the Energy Committee will continue and progress is certainly being made on the Town's energy projects.

Along with continuously researching state and federal grant opportunities to leverage energy investments, this year Town staff have been spending a significant amount of time and financial resources on alternative energy projects:

1) Town staff are working to find a replacement solar <u>site for the one previously proposed</u> adjacent to the industrial park on Hercules Drive, which was <u>ultimately rejected by the Vermont Agency of Natural Resources last year</u>, due to their multiple competing environmental goals. Town staff are in the permitting process



with a <u>site off of Mercier Drive</u>, for which the <u>Selectboard approved \$32,000 for permitting on February 8, 2022</u>. This project, if constructed, will bring the Town from producing about 66% of the electricity consumed in the provision of municipal services by local, cost-effective renewables to about 100%. Our two solar farms generate solar energy credits, which are used to offset electric bills from Green Mountain Power. These credits expire if unused for 24 months. As we increase our production of these credits in hopes to offset all our electric energy use, we have put into place a tracking system to be sure that the credits are used as intended.

 The Selectboard transferred \$558,000 to the Capital Equipment and Facilities fund for use on the next permitted solar farm (which may or may not be the above mentioned location) on July 28<sup>th</sup> 2022.



3) Town staff are working to develop the Colchester Recreation Center with a significant solar component. The goals are to produce electricity equivalent to that consumed 1) in the Center; 2) by the three fire stations that were transferred to Town ownership; 3) by the Town's expanded sewer system.





4) In addition, Town staff are planning public electric car chargers at the Center and at Town Hall. The Town Hall charger may be completed in the next 12 months and is dependent on supply chain and professional installation. An estimated cost including installation comes to approximately \$16,00. When we've looked into car chargers previously, grant funded options required the Town to give away free electricity to the users. We do not anticipate Town taxpayers would appreciate the Town giving away free "fill-ups," funded by all taxpayers. Instead, we plan to use Town funds, as the budget allows, to purchase car chargers that charge users for electricity actually used.
