# The Chittenden Solid Waste District's Need for A New Recycling Facility

Chittenden Solid Waste District

Nearly 30 years ago, the Chittenden Solid Waste District (CSWD) built Vermont's first recycling sorting facility,

known as a Materials Recovery Facility (MRF), where "blue-bin" recyclables are sorted. The current MRF can no longer keep up with modern packaging and the recycling needs of Vermonters today, and the facility is inefficient, outdated and at-capacity. CSWD will be seeking voter approval in this year's General Election to borrow no more than \$22 million to build a new MRF.

The new MRF has several benefits for the environment and economy, and you can visit www.cswd.net/mrf-bond for more information. The CSWD ballot is not eligible to be included on the General Election ballot, but it is available at your Town Clerk's office or by request via http://mvp.vermont.gov (Vermont's My Voter Page). This ballot will also be available on November 8 at all Chittenden County polling places.
