### Manager's Message

Fire & Rescue Chief Appointment: Scott Crady has been appointed as Colchester's next Fire Chief. Scott was chosen from a pool of 32 candidates from across the country. Scott has been Colchester's Rescue Chief since 2018. He began in public safety as a volunteer in the Starksboro Fire Department in 1983, worked in the private sector in construction and heavy equipment operation, and has served in multiple departments as Firefighter and Advanced Emergency Medical Technician, as a



volunteer, paid on call and full-time, in roles ranging from Firefighter/AEMT to Battalion Chief. Along with this appointment, Scott will remain Rescue Chief, as Fire and Rescue departments are often managed by a single individual. However, the Colchester Rescue department will remain distinct and separate from the Colchester Fire department with its own focus on providing paramedic services. Over the next month, Scott will work closely with current Fire Chief Seth Lasker to ensure a smooth transition and will begin his position as Colchester Fire & Rescue Chief on August 18, 2023. ### **Department Updates**

Colchester Police Department: Last Friday, Sergeant Roger Fisher was promoted to the rank of Lieutenant with the Colchester Police Department. Lieutenant Fisher has served in the department for 29 years, including the roles of Patrol Officer, Detective, Corporal, and Sergeant. He has also been a Motorcycle Officer, Field Training Officer, and a Response to Resistance Instructor. He graduated from advanced leadership training at Roger Williams University. Lieutenant Fisher will be the commander of the Operations Division and will now oversee training and the Field Training Officer program (FTO). This program assigns the Town's graduates of the Vermont Police Academy to a certified FTO for twelve weeks where they receive additional training and daily evaluations to become fully trained officers.
