Vermont's Labor Market Update: While Vermont's labor market was stable before the pandemic, according to the U.S. Chamber of Commerce, Vermont has now been categorized as having a severe worker



shortage. Before the pandemic, Vermont had an unemployment rate far lower and a labor force participation much higher than the national rates. As of August, these rates have not recovered, and now, for every 100 open jobs, there are only 36 available workers in Vermont. These trends are important to be aware of and consider. #### **Building history:**

The First Congregational Church of Christ was organized September 14, 1804, at first in a schoolhouse on the Farrand farm, standing on the west side of East Road near the railroad. From there, the church held its meetings in various schools, barns, or homes. In 1838, the brick church was built by the Congregational Church and shared with the Baptist Church until 1861 when the Baptist Church was built.



In 1919, it became the United Church of Colchester. Electricity was installed in both the parish house and the brick church in 1921. Some remodeling also occurred at that time, including installation of the stained-glass windows. The kitchen, restroom, and a coat room were added

in 1927, as well as a furnace in the main room, and the horse sheds were torn down. Later, a new furnace was installed in the cellar.

The United Church of Colchester is Christcentered and family oriented. The pastor is Reverend Doctor Russell E. Willis. For more information about this church, please visit https://www.churchofcolchester.org.



## **Department Updates**

**Colchester Police, Rescue, and Fire Departments**, along with many surrounding emergency services agencies, are participating in Operation Firecuffs again this year.
