The History and Evolution of Colchester Fire Fighting

Saturday, February 10, 10:00 a.m. Parsonage, 828 Main Street

The presenter for this program will be Clark Sweeney, a third-generation member of the Colchester Center Volunteer Fire Company. He served as an engineer, captain, and assistant chief. Clark is the son of Colchester's long-standing and respected community leaders Jerry and Joyce Sweeney. Clark will discuss Colchester fires prior to 1951, the formation of Colchester's fire services, evolution of fire equipment, the three departments, and recent department

Department Updates



Burnham Memorial Library: AARP Tax Aide Service

Public Works: In January, the Town removed an old, abandoned car along the banks of Smith Creek. This important project was completed with funding from the Chittenden Solid Waste District's community clean-up fund and the Town's stormwater program. "It was



great to see over 2,000 pounds of scrap metal removed from the environmentally sensitive area immediately next to Smith Creek," said Karen Adams, of Colchester Public Works. "We are grateful for the support we received from the new property owner, as well as the neighbor who made the project much easier by graciously allowing us access from his property."

This project is part of a series of water quality initiatives planned for the Smith Creek watershed, which drains to Lake Champlain. A public meeting will be held this summer to update the community on the design of stormwater improvements within the Tower Ridge and Everbreeze neighborhoods.
