At-home and Site-based Vaccination Offerings: The Vermont Center for Independent Living is pleased to announce a new partnership with the American Society of Consultant Pharmacists for both home and site-based vaccination.







There is no cost for these visits thanks to a grant from USAging. However, insurance information will be collected and billed for the vaccines including Medicaid, Medicare, and commercial insurance.

Entire households and facilities, including caregivers, friends, residents, and staff, can be vaccinated at once for:

- COVID for ages 3+ (Pfizer and Moderna)
- Flu for all ages (Flucelvax and Fluad 65+)



- Shingles for all 50+ and 19+ who are immunodeficient/immunosuppressed (Shingrix)
- Pneumonia for all 65+ and others 18+ with chronic health conditions/immunocompromised (Prevnar-20)
- RSV for 60+ or people who are 32-36 weeks of pregnancy (Abryvo)
- Tetanus/pertussis for anyone who has not has a booster in past 10 years (Boostrix)

Department Updates



Malletts Bay Sewer Project Update: The Malletts Bay Sewer Project is an environmental abatement project approved by voters in March 2022 to address human waste bacteria in Malletts Bay. The sewer service area includes both sides of West Lakeshore Drive, from Prim Road to East Lakeshore Drive, both sides of East Lakeshore Drive, and a portion of Goodsell Point. A total of 289 properties will be connected to the new sewer system. The wastewater will then be pumped through a no-access force main running the entire length

of Blakely Road to where it will be discharged into the Town's existing sewer system at Severance Corners. The wastewater will then be pumped through the Town's existing sewer system to the Airport Parkway Wastewater Treatment Facility in the City of South Burlington for treatment.

The overall project will take three to four years to complete and will include seven separate construction contracts. Three contracts are planned for 2024-2025 which will include the main sewer lines along West Lakeshore Drive, the no-access force main along Blakely Road, and the two pumping stations planned for the system. For these first three contracts, design, permitting, and right-of-way are now complete, and contract plans and documents are currently being developed. Bid dates for these contracts are tentatively set for the winter-spring of 2024. The remaining work, including the installation of private service laterals on West Lakeshore Drive as well as the sewer mains and private service laterals for East Lakeshore Drive and Goodsell Point are scheduled for 2025-2027.

With the recent receipt of an \$800,000 grant, the total available funding for the project is now \$17.5 million. Total funding is comprised of grants and low interest loans to be paid for through sewer user fees.
