Solar Eclipse Eye Safety and Traffic Disruptions: On April 8, 2024, beginning at approximately 3:26 p.m., a total eclipse of the Sun will be experienced from northern Vermont for the first time since 1932. To view the eclipse, you either need special eclipse glasses or a handheld solar viewer that meets the ISO standards. Please be prepared for significant traffic congestion. A large number of vehicles



and people will be traveling around Vermont and New England the weekend before and especially the day of the eclipse. On April 8th, Burlington will be closing the Beltline and other significant roads including Battery Street, parts of North Avenue, North Champlain Street, and Pearl Street. If you wish to avoid possible significant traffic disruptions—stay home if you can on April 8th—especially if you live West of the Blakely/West Lakeshore Drive intersection. March is Women's History Month—Colchester Historical Society Remembers Ruth E. Wright: This Women's History Month, the Colchester Historical Society is proud to honor and remember Dr. Ruth Etta Wright. Ruth was the author of Colchester Vermont From Ice-Cap to Interstate (Bicentennial Edition, Queen City Printers, 1963), a valuable and detailed history book about the Town of Colchester.

Ruth was born in Colchester, the daughter of Rolla and Della (Cook) Wright. She attended Essex Junction High School, then graduated from Middlebury College in 1923 with a Bachelor of Arts Degree. She received

a master's degree from Columbia University in 1929, and a professional doctorate from American University in Washington in 1933.

Ruth taught at the University of Vermont, 1923-1924; then in 1927, she became a research instructor for the U.S. Government in Washington D.C. From 1936-1940 she worked as a law clerk for a Burlington firm.





Ruth served Colchester in many capacities. She was Town auditor from 1933–1969, and was a member of Opportunity Circle, King's Daughters, and the Vermont Library Association. She belonged to the Colchester United Church and the Colchester Grange. Ruth served as a Vermont Legislator for Colchester in 1943, 1947, and 1951. She served as a library trustee for 25 years, and was treasurer of the Cemetery Association for many years.

Ruth passed away in 1971 at her Colchester home at the age of 68 and is buried in the Colchester Village Cemetery.

"Dr. Wright led an interesting life and certainly served our Town well," said Bonnie Potter, president of the Colchester Historical Society, "and her book continues to be a very important tool for local historians. It's definitely our go-to resource for information about the Town's history that, many times, is not detailed in such a comprehensive manner anywhere else. We are extremely grateful for her energy and efforts in researching, collecting, and recording the historical information in this valuable historical publication; otherwise, it may have been lost, possibly forever."


