National Municipal Clerks Week: In 1984 and in 1994, Presidents Ronald Reagan and Bill Clinton, respectively, signed a Proclamation officially declaring Professional Municipal Clerks Week the first full week of May and recognizing the essential role Municipal Clerks play in local government. This week is a time to appreciate municipal clerks and their work as the professional link between the citizens, the local governing bodies, and the agencies of government at other levels. Staff in the Colchester's Town Clerk's Office keep the official records of the Town from land ownership records to birth, death and civil marriage certificates, conduct local elections, process passports and issue licenses and permits, act as notaries and treasurers, and much more. Norm holds a Bachelor's Degree and State licensure in Civil Engineering. He has worked in Vermont in public works for 33 years in roles ranging from field engineer repairing equipment himself, to City Engineer and assistant department head, leading operations, permitting, and engineering

staff. Norm has successfully managed community-wide projects and has extensive experience in and commitment to the responsible maintenance of municipal infrastructure, which is what our public works team in Colchester does so well.

Norm noted, "I am fortunate to have been given the opportunity to be a part of the Colchester Town staff. I look forward to dedicating myself to the service of the Colchester community. Thank you to everyone that has offered words of encouragement and support. Most importantly I would like to acknowledge and share my appreciation for the dedicated service of my predecessor, Bryan Osborne." Norm will begin work on June 3, with a monthlong overlap with Bryan and will formally step into the Director role on July 1.




Colchester - What do you want to do today?

How Our Historical Gardens Nurture Us

You're invited to spend a relaxing evening with the Colchester Historical Society and learn about the myriad of ways that gardens contribute to our physical, mental, and social well-being. No prior knowledge of gardening is needed, nor do you need to be a gardener.

Using the grounds of the Parsonage as a starting point, we will look at heirloom plants that would likely have been in the garden and what those heirloom plants contribute to us. We will also learn about some favorite plants of our

Department Updates

Parks & Recreation Causeway Race: On Saturday, June 1st, run either a 5K, 10K or 15K and enjoy the scenic Colchester Causeway. The race will begin at Airport Park and follow a gravel trail out onto the historic Causeway where runners will make their way to designated turn-around points on the Causeway before returning to the finish at Airport Park. This race traverses flat gravel and dirt trails surrounded by diverse wetlands and scenic views of Lake Champlain. Proceeds will go towards the



maintenance and improvements to the Causeway for future generations.

This race is open to all ages, however, runners in the 10K and 15K legs must be at least 12 years of age or older. Due to safety concerns, bicycles, roller blades, baby joggers, and running with a dog will not be allowed in the race, or on the path during the race.
