Public Works Updates

We appreciate the traveling public's patience and understanding as we install the Malletts Bay Sewer, which is moving forward on schedule.



West Lakeshore Drive Construction update:

The contractor has completed installation of the western section of the new sewer main, located between the Moorings Marina (the dip in the roadway by 332 West Lakeshore Dr) and Prim Road. Work has begun in the location by the Moorings, moving east toward Bayside Park and the East and West Lakeshore Drive/Blakely Road intersection. The contractor expects to complete installation of the sewer main on West Lakeshore Drive up to Blakely Road by the end of this construction season, picking up in the spring (around May 1) on East Lakeshore Drive.

The contractor has been busy improving the roadway surface with temporary pavement where it was disturbed for the installation of the western section. Restoration of disturbed pavement areas will be completed before the end of this construction season, which is weather-dependent but expected to be late November.

The Town and School District have been coordinating with school opening this week. While minor delays are unavoidable, there are no planned changes to bus stop locations as a result of this season's construction.

Lastly, night work on West Lakeshore Drive is expected to begin in September, with working hours from 9:00 p.m. to 6:00 a.m. More information will be provided to affected property owners prior to beginning this work.

Blakely Road Construction update:

The contractor has installed approximately 5,000 feet of the sewer force main that will connect the Malletts Bay collection system to the existing Town system at Severance Corners. There is approximately 2,000 feet left to complete prior to drilling under I-89, which has been coordinated with the Vermont Agency of Transportation.

Project Description & Phasing

Phase I of this project involves the installation of sewer collection lines along West Lakeshore Drive from Prim Rd to Blakely Rd, a portion of East Lakeshore Drive from Blakely Rd to South Bay Circle, and a no-access transmission line along the length of Blakely Road to connect the new service area into the existing municipal sewer system at Severance Corners. Phase II involves extending the new collection system the full length of East Lakeshore Drive, and installing service connections for East and West Lakeshore Drive property owners so they can begin using the new municipal sewer. Phase III will involve constructing sewer mains and service lines along Goodsell Point. The project is expected to be completed in 2027.

As requested by the State, the Town is sharing the VT Department of Heath's test results and information on mosquitos and the West Nile Virus:

Each week from July to mid-October, mosquitoes are collected from locations around the state and tested for mosquito-borne viruses. Although no human or animal cases of West Nile Virus have been reported in 2024, four of 50 pools of mosquitoes collected on July 30th in Colchester tested positive for the virus. (A mosquito pool is a group of 1-50 mosquitoes of the same species, collected at the same trap location, on the same date.)

When the virus is spread to humans through mosquito bites, most people don't get sick, but some get symptoms like fever, headache, body aches, joint pains, vomiting, diarrhea, or rash. The sickness can become quite serious in some people, and those age 50 or older are at the highest risk.

The Vermont Department of Health shares precautions to prevent mosquito bites and to protect yourself:

- Wear long sleeves and long pants when you're outside.
- Limit the amount of time you spend outdoors at dawn and dusk.
- Use EPA-registered insect repellant.
- Cover cribs, strollers, and baby carriers with mosquito netting.
- Fix holes in your screens and make sure they are tightly attached to doors and windows.
- Get rid of standing water where mosquitoes like to breed.

Driver's Ed now offered by Colchester Parks & Recreation

The Colchester Recreation Department will be offering Driver's Ed programs by the 802 Driving school. The Driver's Ed program will be taught by Joe Barch, who has 15 years of experience teaching in the public schools.

The class runs for six-weeks and meets the State of Vermont DMV requirements. It is essential that the student and their family commit to the time frame. Classes will occur on weekdays in the evening, with driving occurring on weekends. Where daylight permits, there may be an option for driving after school. There is no ability to accommodate for camps, vacations,





sports programs, or any other interruptions, except illness and emergencies. There will be a survey sent out to identify times for driving. When registering, you will receive policies and procedures pertaining to the class that must be adhered to at all times.
