Public Works Update on Mallets Bay Sewer

Overall Update:

There are currently two Mallets Bay Sewer construction contracts:

- Contract 2-Blakely Road Force Main
- Contract 1A-West Lakeshore Drive Mainline Sewer

Contract 2-Blakely Road Force Main

- In winter shutdown: all construction activity suspended until spring
- Project will restart April 2025.

Contract 1A-West Lakeshore Drive Mainline Sewer

Contractor has completed:

- Installation of the Main Line Gravity Sewer from Prim Road to the intersection of West Lakeshore Dr/Blakely Rd/East Lakeshore Dr
- Installation of the sewer laterals from the waterside of West Lakeshore Drive to the land side of West Lakeshore Drive
- Pressure testing of West Lakeshore Mainline Gravity Sewer was successfully completed

November 14th-December 3rd: On weekdays from 7 a.m. to 5 p.m. the contractor will be advancing or continuing the following, subject to change as a result of less than favorable weather conditions.

- West Lakeshore Drive- beginning at Bayside Park heading west to Prim Road
- Repaving of Sewer Service Laterals on the south (land) side of West Lakeshore Drive
- Lowering Manhole structures within trenchline in preparation for milling trenchline on north (lake) side of West Lakeshore Drive
- Milling approximately 15' width of roadway surface on north (lake) side of West Lakeshore Drive.
- Milling approximately 9' width of trenchline on north (lake) side of West Lakeshore Drive
- Base paving trenchline on north (lake) side of West Lakeshore Drive, following behind trenchline milling operation
- Raising manhole structures to finish grade
- Paving-Final 2" wear course from Bayside Park to Prim Road

The paving operation will require alternating one-way traffic. *The alternating one-way traffic will vary in length with the trenchline milling operation positioned ahead of the base paving operation. Motorists should anticipate significant delays during the period this work is underway.*

Traffic demand on West Lakeshore Drive shifts dramatically throughout the week. This requires an ongoing effort to restructure the traffic control plan. In turn it is challenging to predict the delay you might experience on a daily basis.

We understand this can be challenging predicting how much additional time is needed in your travel time through the project corridor. We understand it impacts your time and arrival to your respective destinations. We apologize for this inconvenience, and we are doing our best to limit that impact.

We ask that the driving public:

- Seek alternate routes where possible

- Anticipate the delays this coming week will be more extreme than previous weeks
- Please adjust your schedule the best you can for the anticipated delays

This is the last push to close out the construction season. It will also conclude the vast majority of the work along West Lakeshore Drive-- for the duration of this three-year project. We appreciate your continued patience.

A Message from VTrans: Exit 17 Construction Update

TRAFFIC IMPACT AND DURATION: From Sunday, November 17, at 8 p.m. to Friday, November 22, at 6 a.m., the Interstate 89 (I-89) northbound and southbound lanes at the Exit 17 interchange will be closed from 8 p.m. to 6 a.m. each night.

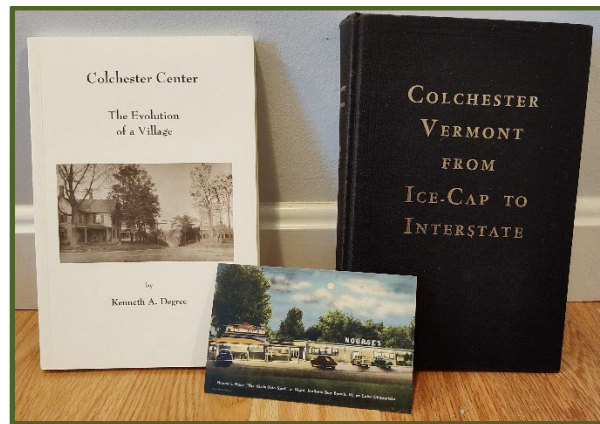
During the nighttime closures, traffic will be maintained via detour routes. The existing U.S. Route 2 (U.S. 2) bridge over I-89 will have a single-lane reduction, with two lanes of traffic maintained.

Temporary traffic control signage and portable changeable message boards will be installed along the detour routes to guide travelers. Southbound traffic on I-89 will be directed to exit the interstate at Exit 17, turn left onto U.S. 2., and immediately re-enter I-89 using the southbound on-ramp at the Exit 17 interchange.

Northbound traffic on I-89 will be detoured to exit the interstate at Exit 16 in Colchester, travel approximately 6.3 miles on U.S. 2/U.S. 7 to the Exit 17 interchange, and re-enter I-89 using the northbound on-ramp at the Exit 17 interchange.

From Monday, November 18, through Friday, November 22, I-89 will be intermittently reduced to a single lane in both directions near Exit 17 during daytime off-peak hours: 6 a.m. to 3 p.m. on I-89 northbound and 9 a.m. to 8 p.m. on I-89 southbound throughout the week. The I-89 northbound off-ramp slip lane to U.S. 2 westbound will remain closed 24/7 for bridge construction. Motorists can turn right or left onto U.S. 2 at the signalized intersection. The construction schedule is subject to change due to weather and other field variables.
