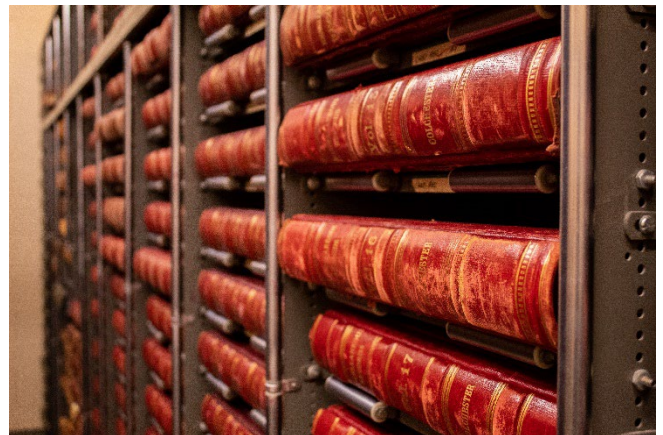
We would like to celebrate all the municipal clerks who support countless essential functions of our Town government. We are incredibly grateful for the service that our clerks provide to the community.

New Permanently Affordable Housing Units Opening in Colchester

Sixty-five new permanently affordable apartments are officially open in Colchester's Fort Ethan Allen neighborhood. The renovated buildings had been army barracks in the early 20th century, and dorms for St. Michael's College students in the 2000's.

The new apartments are a mix of one-bedroom and studio apartments, something lacking in the neighborhood. Rents for these apartments will average about half of what other newly constructed apartments in the area are renting for and will include heat and hot water.



Champlain Housing Trust (CHT), in partnership with Evernorth, and with support ranging from encouraging policies to funding from organizations including the Town of Colchester and EastRise Credit Union, was able to rehabilitate the century-old buildings into needed housing units.

Colchester Selectboard Clerk, Jacki Murphy, commended all entities involved for their hard work. Clerk Murphy noted the difficulties that come with converting old buildings and doing so with funding from multiple sources. The Town is excited to see needed housing, especially at an affordable price, being built.

A Message from VTrans: Exit 17 Construction Update

TRAFFIC ALERT: Beginning Sunday, May 4th and continuing through Friday, May 9, at 6 a.m., the Interstate 89 (I-89) Exit 17 northbound off-ramp will be closed at night between 7 p.m. and 6 a.m. to facilitate the construction of the new off-ramp.

During these nighttime closures, I-89 northbound traffic will be directed to exit the interstate at the Exit 15 interchange in Winooski, turn left onto Vermont 15 (VT 15), make the first right turn out of the circulator onto U.S. Route 2/7 (U.S. 2/7), and travel approximately 7.5 miles north to the Chimney Corner intersection of U.S. Route 7 (U.S. 2/7) and U.S. 2, or exit the interstate at the Exit 18 interchange in Milton, turn right onto U.S. 7, and travel approximately 9.5 miles south to the Chimney Corner intersection.

From Sunday, May 4, at 7 p.m. to Friday, May 9, at 8 p.m., I-89 will be reduced to a single lane in both directions near Exit 17, except during peak hours (3 p.m. to 8 p.m. for I-89 northbound and 6 a.m. to 9 a.m. for I-89 southbound).

Temporary traffic control signage and portable changeable message boards are installed along the detour routes to guide travelers. The signed detour routes are shown in the graphics below.

Called Struggle Food or Crisis Food, the recipes of the 1920s to 1940s were fascinating. During a period of economic hardship, shortages of ingredients had ingenious cooks producing delicious, sweet treats that made life a little bit better. Join us at the Colchester Historical Society to learn about the background that produced Depression Cake, War Cake, and Water Pie. During a time when sugar, butter, eggs, and white flour were scarce, Americans were still able to occasionally indulge their sweet tooth and have a worthy dessert for a family celebration.

After the presentation, tea will be served along with cakes, scones, and cookies from those tumultuous economic times. Enjoy "Desperation Desserts" and a cup of tea. Tours of the Parsonage and perennial gardens will be available as well.
