On April 3, 2025, the Chittenden County Regional Planning Commission (CCRPC) held a meeting at Colchester Town Hall regarding potential safety improvements at the intersection.

This meeting is the beginning of CCRPC's scoping study of the area, a project that will involve a comprehensive review of the traffic corridor to determine the best long-term solutions for improving safety.



Various members of the public shared their concerns about the current conditions at the intersection. In order to make meaningful safety changes at this intersection, it is imperative to continue to hear from the public. We appreciate everyone who has made their voices heard throughout this process.

The next steps in CCRPC's scoping study will involve additional public input meetings and evaluating possible long-term safety improvements.

Essex Community Justice Center: April Newsletter



The Essex Community Justice Center (ECJC) works with many Chittenden County municipalities and police forces (including the Colchester Police Department) to provide restorative justice to the community. The goal of restorative justice is to give an alternative route for cases, rather than prosecution and the traditional criminal legal system.

ECJC does this by allowing law enforcement officials to refer low-level offenders to their pre-charge program where offenders will appear in front of panels comprised of community members to be held accountable for their actions.

ECJC's April Newsletter gives an update on the statistics from their Restorative Justice Panels as well as information from volunteers on ECJC's panels.

This newsletter serves to update residents in the communities served by the ECJC as well as shine a light on the staff and volunteers who make community justice in our area a reality.

The program focuses on safe, low-impact activities tailored to individual abilities and





incorporates equipment like TRX straps, steppers, balance sticks, and resistance bands for added support. Regular participation can enhance posture, mobility, and overall well-being.

Community Rock Painting (Monday, June 30 at 1:00 PM) Come spend an early afternoon painting a collection of rocks to place around the community and bring joy to those who find them! Paint words of encouragement, beautiful scenery or special designs on individual rocks. Once they are dry, they will be placed in various areas throughout Colchester.
