### **Rabid Skunk Reported in Colchester**

The Health Department noted a recent case of rabies in a skunk in the Town of Colchester. The State shared that the skunk was found in the area of **Church Road and Diane Lane.**

Please take steps to protect humans and domestic animals from rabies.





If you are bitten by an animal: wash the wound very well with soap and water and contact your health care provider. Follow all their instructions.

If your pet or farm animal was exposed to a wild or stray animal that might have rabies: contact your veterinarian. State law requires dogs and cats to be vaccinated for rabies — even barn cats.

If you see a wild or stray animal acting strangely, or are concerned about a rabies exposure, call the **Rabies Hotline (1-800-4-RABIES)** or report it to your town's animal control officer.

Do not touch or pick up wild or stray animals – even baby animals – or try to make them into pets. Doing so can put yourself or your family at risk of exposure through a bite or scratch. You can't tell if an animal has rabies just by looking at it. Interacting with young wildlife may result in them being orphaned or tested for rabies, which requires humanely euthanizing the animal. So, for their own sake, leave wildlife in the wild.

Rabies is a deadly viral disease of the brain that infects mammals and is fatal to both humans and animals. In Vermont, rabies is most commonly found in wild animals such as raccoons, skunks, foxes, bats and woodchucks. Cats, dogs and livestock can also get rabies if they have not been vaccinated. Rabies virus is spread through the bite of an infected animal. Rabies is transmitted when the virus is introduced into a bite wound, open cuts on the skin, or onto mucous membranes like the mouth or eyes.

#### **Colchester Historical Society Celebrates 50th Anniversary**

The Colchester Historical Society celebrated its 50th Anniversary with a barbecue and special presentations. The group was bestowed an Award of Merit from the League of Local Historical Societies and Museums. The judges were impressed by everything the Society has done to date, especially how it works to promote and be involved in the Colchester community, regional, and statewide history initiatives. "Some of their accomplishments include the continued management of its museum, welcoming visitors to the Colchester Log Schoolhouse, working to involve Colchester students in local history learning opportunities, undertaking a very robust year-long schedule of programming, and even working on updating their governing documents," Eileen Corcoran said. "Especially notable is their continuous communication efforts about Colchester's wonderful history, which is widely distributed by means of website updates, a quarterly newsletter, weekly postings on local Facebook pages and frequent articles of interest in Front Porch Forum, the Town Manager's Newsletter, and through articles in the Colchester Sun," she added.

A new slate of officers was voted in as the Board of Directors: Bonnie Potter, president; Jack Penca, vice president; Bob Furst, treasurer; Pat Carman, Secretary; and directors Clinton Reichard, Curt Taylor, and Fran Bailey.
